

Who is the CNC?



The Corryong Neighbourhood Centre (CNC) was formed in 2012 with the joining together of the Corryong Education Centre (CEC) and the Corryong Neighbourhood House. The amalgamation ensured the ongoing provision of Neighbourhood House services and adult education in Corryong while reducing overhead costs and providing the capacity for growth and diversification to better understand and meet the community's needs.

The CNC is a Victorian Incorporated Association run by a volunteer Committee and managed on a day-to-day basis by 2 full time Co-ordinators. The CNC currently operates with 25 paid employees and >10 regular volunteers.

The Committee consists of a minimum of 5 (currently 8) members and includes the 2 Co-ordinators. The principal requirement for the Committee role is a commitment to the Upper Murray Community and the CNC's vision and mission. However additional skills gained through business, community participation and life experience enhance the contribution made by the Committee members to the CNC's operations and direction.

How does the CNC Social Enterprise model work?

The social enterprise model developed by and for the CNC requires that the enterprise:

- fills a gap in local community services (ie taking over an existing business or expanding or providing a new service)
- does not set up in direct competition with an existing private business
- has potential for growth, improvement and modernization
- provides ongoing employment and training, including opportunities for marginalized and young people
- can become a sustainable, viable business within a reasonable timeframe
- can financially support itself from commencement through operations and direct funding
- has the potential to make a future financial and operational contribution to the CNC and the Upper Murray community
- operates in a manner consistent with the CNC's vision and mission
- is managed by a suitably qualified person who is committed to good business practice, ongoing training and the social enterprise model
